THE GOSPEL

In the morning, while it was still very dark, Jesus got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he praved. And Simon and his companions hunted for him. When they found him, they said to him, "Everyone is searching for you." He answered, "Let us go on to the neighboring towns, so that I may proclaim the message there also: for that is what I came out to do." And he went throughout Galilee, proclaiming the message in their synagogues and casting out demons. A leper came to him begging him, and kneeling he said to him, "If you choose, you can make me clean." Moved with pity, Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him, and said to him, "I do choose. Be made clean!" Immediately the leprosy left him, and he was made clean. After sternly warning him he sent him away at once, saying to him, "See that you say nothing to anyone; but go, show yourself to the priest, and offer for your cleansing what Moses commanded, as a testimony to them." But he went out and began to proclaim it freely, and to spread the word, so that Jesus could no longer go into a town openly, but stayed out in the country; and people came to him from every quarter.

THE EPISTLE

Do not let sin exercise dominion in your mortal bodies, to make you obey their passions. No longer present your members to sin as instruments of wickedness, but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from death to life, and present your members to God as instruments of righteousness. For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace. What then? Should we sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means! Do you not know that if you present yourselves to anyone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one whom you obey, either of sin, which leads to death, or of obedience, which leads to righteousness? But thanks be to God that you, having once been slaves of sin, have become obedient from the heart to the form of teaching to which you were entrusted, and that you, having been set free from sin, have become slaves of righteousness. For just as you once presented your members as slaves to impurity and to greater and greater iniquity, so now present your members as slaves to righteousness for sanctification. When you were slaves of sin, you were free in regard to righteousness. So what advantage did you then get from the things of which you now are ashamed? The end of those things is death. But now that you have been freed from sin and enslaved to God, the advantage you get is sanctification. The end is eternal life. For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ. Jesus our Lord.

لهم:" ضحوا للآلهة فيعظم شأنكم، والا تجردون من مناطق جنديتكم". فأجابوا:" خير لنا ان نخسر مناطق جنديتنا ولا نخسر يسوع المسيح الهنا".فارسلهم الى السجن، حيث قضوا الليل بالصلاة. فظهر لهم الرب بغتة يشجعهم وبقويم على الثبات حتى النهاية لنيل اكليل الشهادة. وفي اليوم الثاني، اخذ الوالي يتملقهم فلم ينل منهم مأرباً. فأمر باعادتهم الى سجنهم. وجاء قائدهُم ليسياس يسعى في إستمالتهم، فلم ينجح. فتهددهم بنزع مناطقهم. فأجابه احدهم كتديوس:" انتزع مناطقنا فانك لا تقدر ان تزحزحناً عن محبة المسيح". فحنق وأمر فضربوهم بالحجارة على وجوههم، فكانت الحجارة تعود ألى الضاربين. فأمر الوالى بان يطرحوهم في بحيرة قد تجلد ماؤها. فكان يشجع بعضهُم بعضاً قائليُّنَّ:" نزلنا اربُعينُ إلى ألماء، سنذهب اربعين إلى السماء". غير انه، لشدة البرد فرغ صبر أحدهم، فخرج من الماء ودخل حماماً، فخارت قواه ومات. فحزن الشهداء لكنهم تشددوا بالصلاة والعون الالهي. وبغتة رأى أحد الحراس نورأ ساطعاً وإذا بملائكة يحملون اكاليل لرؤوس التسعة والثلاثين شهيداً. فدهش من هذا المشهد العجيب وحركت النعمة قلبه، فصرخ برفاقه: انا مسيحى! ورمى ذاته في الماء. فنال الاكليل الذي خسره ذلك الجبان المسكين. فاصبح الشهداء، كما تَمنَّوا، أربِعين شهيداً. وكانَّ ذلك في التاسع من شهر آذار سنة ٣٢٠. صلاتهم تكون معنا. آمين.

Bishop's Corner – Sunday of the Leper

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Our Gospels for the Season of Great Lent in the Maronite Church focus on some of the miracles of Christ during his mission on earth. This Sunday, we reflect on the Healing of the Leper (Mark 1:35-43). As I mentioned in my message on Cana Sunday, the theme for our Maronite Lenten Homilies this year is "You are Apostles of Hope!" and this week we reflect on hope and mercy.

Leprosy was one of the most impure diseases for the Jews, so much so that lepers were not allowed to approach others and were cast out of the community. Yet the leper in our Gospel defies this ban, because he had faith and hope that the Lord can heal him. His approach is not one of pride. He recognizes himself as a sinner, and in all humility, he begs the Lord to heal him. Jesus does not ask for more. He heals him and asks him to go and show himself to the priests of the temple so that he can be allowed to join the community again.

What does this mean in our life today? Leprosy is like sin. It separates us from God and our community. Only the Lord can heal us if we approach him in hope, faith, and humility. And during this time of Lent, I encourage you to approach the Sacrament of Reconciliation, where the priest, in the name of the Lord, forgives us our sins and restores us to the communion of the Church.

If we do not recognise our sins and admit them, there is a danger that, over time, our hearts will harden and a distance will be created between us and God. Let us ask the Lord to make us aware of our need for forgiveness. Our parishes offer many opportunities for prayer, adoration and confession in Lent.

The Lord showed his mercy and compassion both for the leper and the people who sought Him. If we approach him with the same faith and the same confidence as the leper saying: "If you choose, you can make me clean." (Mk 1:40), we can be filled with hope in His mercy and his reply: "I do choose. Be made clean!" (Mk 1:41).

When we look at the world around us, we pray that the Lord's compassion touches the hearts of world leaders so they work for peace. **We pray for an end to the war in Ukraine.** We know the immense cost of war. There can never be any winners in an armed conflict, but only losers.

We also think on this Sunday of our brothers and sisters in Queensland and New South Wales affected by the floods. We pray for those who passed away that their souls rest in peace. May God also grant hope to those who lost their homes and livelihoods so they can rebuild what was lost.

Let us remember that the Lord can make possible what would be impossible for us. Our hope is in His mercy and compassion.

The 40 Martyrs - 9 March

he 40 Martyrs were Roman soldiers who were put to death in Sebaste, which is in Armenia today. The account of these martyrs is welldocumented historically, and inspired great faithfulness in the ancient Church. Around the year 320, the emperor of the eastern Roman empire, Lucinius, issued a decree ordering every Christian to renounce their faith or face death. When this decree was announced to the Roman army, 40 soldiers of different nationalities—all part of a famous "Thundering Legion"—refused to comply with the order to sacrifice to Roman gods. They were brought to trial in Sebaste, and the governor there threatened them with disgrace if they continued, and promised promotions for any who renounced their faith. They all stood firm. The governor then devised a plan to test their faith. They were to be placed upon a frozen lake, naked and exposed to the howling wind, until they either changed their minds or froze to death. The 40 did not wait to be stripped, but undressed themselves, and encouraged one another in the ordeal. A fire and warm baths were prepared at the edge of the lake, and they were told that they could come in from the ice and warm themselves if they turned away from Christianity. For three days and nights, the group endured. One young soldier decided to leave the group for the warmth of the baths, but the shock to his system killed him. One of the guards, seeing this disgrace, was inspired by the resolve of the remaining 39. When he was off-duty, he fell asleep by the fire and had a dream in which angels descended upon the soldiers on the lake and crowned them. He counted only 39 crowns, and decided to join them. He put down his arms and cloak, proclaimed himself a Christian, and walked out to the group on the ice, bringing the number of martyrs back to 40. By the morning of the fourth day, most were dead, and the remaining were killed. All the bodies were burned in a furnace, and their ashes thrown into a river. The Christian community recovered some of the charred remains. Forty M

قَامَ يَسُوعُ قَبْلَ طُلُوع الفَجْرِ، فخَرَجَ وذَهَبَ إلى مَكَانٍ قَفْرٍ، وأَخَذَ يُصَلِّي هُنَاك. ولَحِقَ بهِ سِمْعَانُ وَالَّذِينِ مَعَهُ، ووَجَدُوهُ فَقَالُوا لَهُ: "أَلْجَمِيعُ يَطْلُبُونَكَ". فقالَ لَهُمِ: "لِنَذْهَبْ إِلَى مَكَانٍ آخَرٍ، إِلَى القُرَى المُجَاوِرَة، لأَبَشِّرَ هُنَاكَ أَيْضًا، فَإِنِّي لِهِذَا خَرَجْتُ". وسَاَرَ في كُلّ الجَليل، وهُوَ يَكْرِزُ في مَجَامِعِهم وَبَطْرُدُ الشَّيَاطِينِ. وأَتَاهُ أَبْرَصُ يَتَوَسَّلُ إِلَيْه، فجَثَا وقَالَ لَهُ: "إِنْ شَئْتَ فَأَنْتَ قَادِرٌ أَنْ تُطَهِّرَنِي!". فتَحَنَّنَ يَسُوعُ ومَدَّ يَدَهُ ولَمَسَهُ وقَالَ لَهُ: اقَدْ شِئْتُ، فَاطْهُرْ!". وفي الحَالِ زَالَ عَنْهُ البَرَصِ، فَطَهُرَ. فَانْتَهَرَهُ يَسُوعُ وصَرَفَهُ حَالاً، وقالَ لَهُ: "أَنْظُرْ، لا تُخْبِرْ أَحَدًا بِشَىء، بَلِ اذْهَبْ وَأَر نَفْسَكَ للْكَاهِنِ، وَقَبِّمْ عَنْ طُهْرِكَ مَا أَمَرَ بِهِ مُوسَى، شَهَادَةً لَهُم". أَمَّا هُوَ فَخَرَجَ وِبَدَأَ يُنَادِي بِأَعْلَى صَوْتِهِ وِنُذِيعُ الْخَبَر، حَتَّى إِنَّ يَسُوعَ لَمْ يَعُدْ قَادِرًا أَنْ يَدْخُلَ إِلَى مَدِينَةٍ عَلانِيَة، بَلْ كَانَ يُقِيمُ فِي الْخَارِج، فِي أَمَاكِنَ مُقْفِرَة، وكانَ النَّاسُ يَأْتُونَ إِلَيْهِ مِنْ كُلِّ مَكَان.
